We aim to build a state-of-the-art sanctuary that will serve as a safe haven for dogs in need as well as a community hub, providing education and support for dog owners.


Jenna Jones, Founder


in local government, Adam brings experience of strategy, governance and commercial scrutiny to One Wish.

Action is needed. NOW!

There is more need than ever for dog rescue services in the UK. We're stepping in with a local solution and a national vision.

Covid-19 was undoubtedly a catalyst for the current crisis. This period saw an unprecedented boom in irresponsible puppy breeding and impulse buying. High numbers of dogs purchased during the pandemic continue to be surrendered to rescues or abandoned for a plethora of reasons including behavioural issues due to an early lack of socialisation.

The current cost of living crisis has further exacerbated the problem. Owners are struggling to afford to care for their pets, whether that's food or vet bills, leading to more dogs than ever being surrendered to rescue or abandoned.

The irresponsible breeding crisis continues thanks to "convenience culture". Dog breeding is still unlicensed and unregulated, and the number of backyard breeders is on the rise. More dogs are being bred (and interbred) in poor conditions which do not meet their welfare needs. As a consequence, their puppies often develop health and temperament problems.

Rescue & rehome

We will:

- Rescue and rehome every unwanted and abandoned dog that needs us
- Offer love and care to stray dogs and dogs surrendered by owners facing hardship, and find their forever homes
- Care for dogs in carefully selected foster homes or at our sanctuary
- Build a sanctuary to offer a lifelong haven for dogs who aren't able to be rehomed



Educate & promote

We will:

- Work tirelessly to educate the public about dog welfare and promote responsible dog ownership
- Run public-facing campaigns and seek to open up dialogue about real-life challenges
- Encourage new potential owners to consider adopting from rescue charities
- Offer support and guidance to current and potential dog owners



Support our community

We will:

- Create a place of community and support for all owners in need
- Provide free training and socialisation opportunities for rescue dog owners
- Offer a free-to-hire secure field at our sanctuary and a dog-friendly café for owners to feel part of a community
- Provide a dog food bank and access to low-cost veterinary services
- Offer temporary care for dogs whose owners are facing short term hardships



Campaign for change

We will:

- Be the voice for all dogs, always aware they cannot advocate for themselves
- Defend their rights.
 Campaign to bring in changes to protect their welfare
- Tackle the root causes of poor dog welfare and work to prevent them
- Fiercely drive for positive change, working alongside other rescues, our supporters, the media and policy makers

Initial Set Up

We start with heart, and build with strategy.

Our initial setup from June to December 2025 will include:

Establishing a foster network by recruiting and training volunteer fosterers.

Setting up administrative and operational systems to manage surrenders and adoptions responsibly.

Creating robust and scalable policies and procedures to set us up for future success with strong governance.

Sourcing funding and support through brilliant awareness campaigns.

Building partnerships with local businesses, vets, wardens and Councils.



Fundraising Plan

To raise the necessary funds for our startup and initial operations, we will:

Launch a Crowdfunding campaign to gather initial financial support.

Apply for grants from animal welfare organisations, local authorities and foundations.

Reach out to local business for sponsorship and donations.

Organise local fundraising events such as charity walks, galas and auctions.

Attend local community events for awareness and donations.



Ongoing Operations

Ongoing operations will include:

Rescuing and rehoming dogs through our foster network and sanctuary.

Caring for rescued dogs via medical care, food and shelter.

Developing and implementing educational plans and campaigns.

Supporting rescue dog owners with resources and assistance.

Maintaining fundraising efforts to ensure financial stability and growth.

We will work to maximise the impact of every penny we spend during our first year of operation. Our focus will be to build the brand sustainably whilst delivering our 4 Pillars of Promise.
